Check the Source of Information

Once you find out the source, check for other things like the credentials, reputation, and agenda of the source and find out if they have any biases, conflicts of interest, or other motives.

Plus, you can also look for this information elsewhere on the internet, including reputable websites and magazines, official sources like American's Wi-Fi information page, and experts in the industry to ensure that the information is, in fact, accurate and reliable.

Evaluate the Evidence Related to Research

The next step is to evaluate the evidence. Once you are done finding and checking the source of the information, evaluate the evidence related to the information. This includes evaluating the kind of evidence presented with the information and finding out how reliable, relevant, and recent the evidence is and whether the evidence is purely opinions, emotions, or assumptions or is based on facts, research, and data.

You can also confirm whether the evidence confirms or contradicts the information. Tools like Google Images or FactCheck can help verify the authenticity and accuracy of claims. You can also evaluate and check the evidence on the company's website and other official websites related to the information.

Analyze the Argument Behind the Information

Since every piece of information has some argument behind it that conveys the information, the next thing you can do is verify the information on the internet by analyzing the argument. You should analyze the argument and see if it is logical, coherent, and makes sense. A valid and logical argument is easily understandable, while an invalid one that jumps from one point to another without explanation doesn't make much sense.

Compare with Other Sources of Information

Comparing the information you just received on the internet with other sources of information is important to verify its credibility and accuracy. Finding out how the information compares with other sources on the same topic, issue, or question and whether the information agrees or disagrees with other sources is important to know whether the information is correct or not.

Most of the time, people spread information without comparing it with other sources of information on the same topic. Comparing will let you know whether the information is available from other sources and, if it is, how it compares with them.

Reflect and Question Your Understanding

The next tip for verifying information on the internet is to reflect on and question your understanding and interpretation of the information and how the information that you received affects your existing knowledge, beliefs, and values. Reflecting on all the evidence and sources, along with your understanding and interpretation, is important to determine the accuracy of the information.

Most people focus on the evidence and sources that support their original beliefs, which makes them reluctant to pick right from wrong. Please don't underestimate the opposing evidence, as it can help you verify the information.
