Encrypt data upload to a chosen server or cloud service (FTP, Amazon S3, WebDAV, Dropbox, Google Drive, OneDrive, Backblaze B2).

Storage Connection Manager

Commander One supports several widely used cloud services. Setting up these services within the system only takes a few steps, and users can then easily access their files.

FTP Manager - You can access any server supporting the most popular protocol. Includes support for SFTP and FTPS as well.

Google Drive - Mount all your drives simultaneously and work on separate sheets with the dual panel interface.

Amazon S3 - You can mount buckets or entire servers in seconds and link multiple accounts.

WebDAV - Access your servers directly from the app by connecting to the powerful web protocol.

OneDrive - Our system is designed to support Microsoft account linking and the use of multiple accounts simultaneously.

OpenStack - You can mount your files directly onto your computer without synchronization and transfer.
