The User Account Control in Windows 10 OS prevents the installation of applications without any prior permission from the machine's owner. Undoubtedly, Windows 10 is known to give the user a considerable amount of control over what happens on their computer, the applications they run, how they interact on the internet and how their data is stored.

What Windows 10 is Unable to Do

Despite all the fantastic features that this operating system has, there are few things that Windows 10 cannot do when it comes to security.

Firstly, Windows 10 OS is unable to hide your IP address. It is not able to encrypt the data that enters and leaves the machine. The data can only be encrypted once it is on the device, and this is a significant loophole due to which hackers might hijack the data and read the content.

Moreover, any 3rd-party with the correct tools can tell the websites you visit and the content you consume, and this can be a significant breach of your privacy. For example, you can target top personalized marketing campaigns, and it can overwhelm you. The security features offered by Windows 10 do not provide you with the ability to avoid the censorship that is imposed due to geographical location.
