Customizing Your Facebook URL (Username)

A custom Facebook URL replaces the long numeric ID with a cleaner username, such as '/YourBrand'.

Eligibility Requirements

Requirement: Unique Username | Details: Must not be in use by another profile or page.

Requirement: Allowed Characters | Details: A-Z, 0-9, periods (no spaces or underscores).

Requirement: Minimum Length | Details: At least 5 characters (except for major brands).

Requirement: Admin Role (for Pages) | Details: Only page admins can assign/edit usernames.

Requirement: Account Health | Details: New or inactive pages may require verification or engagement history.

How to Create or Change Your Username

For Personal Profiles (Desktop)

1. Go to Settings & Privacy > Settings .
2. Under Meta Accounts Center , select Profiles > Username .
3. Type your desired name and check availability.
4. Click Done , confirm your password, and save.

For Business Pages (New Page Experience)

1. Switch to your page via "See All Profiles".
2. Navigate to Settings > Page Setup .
3. Edit the Username section.
4. Type your preferred name and save changes.
