You'll be happy to know that the answer is "Yes"-sometimes. So, to give a few tried-and-tested home remedies a shot before you call in expert backup, you should know how to remove scratches from your phone screen.

How to Fix Scratches on Your Phone the Safe Way

In this article, we will see some of the simple homemade tricks to fix the scratches on the phone screen. However, before proceeding further, make sure to do some important steps.

It is always essential to power off the device before doing anything on your mobile. That will help you to avoid any unnecessary issues. Also, make sure to seal all the available ports on the handset in this step. We use some liquid products that can enter the handset if made open. So make sure to close all the open ports like the charging port, headphone jack, etc.

Try Some Toothpaste

With a cheap product you should have at home, this simple method can help you deal with tiny marks on your screen. Because toothpaste contains microscopic abrasive substances to help clean your teeth, you can use it to buff out the scratch on your phone essentially.

Take a little toothpaste onto a cotton swab or microfiber cloths, with small, gentle circles, rub the toothpaste over the affected area. In time, you should see the scratch start to fade and disappear. Once done with it, you can clear the remaining toothpaste on the screen using some smooth piece of cloth.

Erasers

It might sound too good to be accurate, but this method can truly work if you've got your phone scratched! A rubber eraser can fill in the scratch, making it less visible, though this isn't always a long-term solution.

Magic Erasers

Want to upgrade the tip above? A Magic Eraser-the type used for cleaning, popularly sold by Mr. Clean-can help remove stubborn scratches with ease.

Note that this tip, like the toothpaste above, works because Magic Erasers use abrasion to buff out scratches. In other words, you'll need to stop often and check to see whether you've worn away the screen or begun to cause any damage. If you're not careful or use too much pressure, you could buff too much of your screen away!

Baking Soda

This magical cleaning substance works excellent for phone scratches as well. However, because we'll need to add liquid to the mix, you'll need to be extra careful to avoid letting it get into any interior parts of your phone.

Mix one-part water and two parts baking soda to get started, stirring until combined. Apply the resulting paste to a clean cloth, and rub it into the screen in gentle circles. Once you feel like the scratch has faded enough, use a damp cloth to remove any leftover baking soda.

Car Polishing Products

You might be surprised to learn that the kinds of products that get scratches out of your car can also work on your phone-as long as you use them with care. Make sure to grab a quality product and follow the instructions on the label with care. As with the methods above, stop often to see how much pressure you're using and to check how much of the scratch has faded.

Get a Professional Screen Replacement

It should come as no surprise that the safest option for screen scratch repair is a professional screen replacement. It is especially true if you're dealing with deep or expensive scratches that would be hard or impossible to fix with the simple remedies on this list. So whether you have an iPhone or an Android, professional screen replacements will often be your best bet-though specific options can be pricey.

For Apple users without a warranty, you could spend up to \$149 for a screen replacement. However, it's worth noting that many reputable third-party companies can do the same job for a fraction of the price.
