

How to Restore iPhone by Factory Resetting

Quick answer

How to Factory Reset Your iPhone

3. On your computer, open iTunes (Windows and older Macs) or Finder (newer Macs)
4. When prompted, choose "Restore"
5. Wait for the process to complete

What Happens During a Factory Reset?

When you factory reset your iPhone, the following occurs:

1. All your personal data is erased, including photos, messages, and apps
2. Your settings are returned to their default state

4. The latest version of iOS is installed
