 - Smart Lists : Filter tasks by tags, priorities, and due dates.

Apple Calendar: Scheduling and Time Management

- Best for : Fixed commitments like meetings, appointments, and deadlines.

- Why?

- System-level integration with reliable reminders and notifications.
- Color-coded events for visual clarity (e.g., blue for meetings, orange for personal tasks).

Step 4: Automation and Voice Commands

Direct Siri Commands to TickTick

To bypass Apple Reminders and add tasks directly to TickTick:

- Create Siri Shortcuts in the Shortcuts app.
