On the other hand, Brave is a free and open-source web browser developed by Brave Software, Inc. It is built on the Chromium framework and standouts as a privacy-focused browser by default. Brave automatically block certain advertisements and website trackers, enabling users' privacy and security.

However, Brave still allows users to enable ads for rewarding attention with Basic Attention Tokens (BAT) (a cryptocurrency). Users can further utilize BAT for payments to registered websites and content creators. It adds up as a unique approach to advertising and monetization.

Vivaldi Vs. Brave - Quick Comparison

Syncing Options

Syncing works very differently in Vivaldi and Brave. Vivaldi features an account that can sync data. Brave forms a QR code or a Sync code for connecting two different devices. The below table show details of what both browsers support:

Platform Compatibility

Vivaldi is compatible across Windows, macOS, and Linux and has an Android app, but still no version for iOS users. Similarly, Vivaldi is the world's first web browser for the Android automotive operating system. Brave is available on Android, iOS, Windows, and the App Store for iPhone devices.

Privacy and Security

When comparing Vivaldi and Brave, privacy and security are the most important to consider. Both browsers offer robust tools and functionalities, but privacy differs.

Vivaldi comes with multiple privacy and security options. It offers three blocking options: No Blocking, Block Trackers, or Block Trackers and Ads. It allows individual websites to manage to block/allow in the browser settings. Using some Google services, Vivaldi offers additional security measures, including phishing and malware protection.

With DNS, it also helps with navigation errors and autofill assistance. Vivaldi does not track user activity but collects minimal anonymized usage data. It, however, comes with built-in ad and tracker-blocking features. Vivaldi comes with multiple privacy-focused extensions allowing users to enhance their privacy.

On the other hand, Brave is more prominent regarding privacy and security. With the Brave Shield feature, this browser takes an advance and proactive approach to privacy. Brave Shield automatically blocks third-party cookies and ads. It even protects users from ad trackers. Users can navigate to Setting and disable Brave's own ads.

Brave offers users to choose between two levels of protection: Standard and No Protection. The standard level allows users to check unhealthy websites, downloads, and extensions. In contrast, No Protection disables any checks. Brave also includes HTTP to HTTPS upgrader to ensure secure data transmission.

The choice between the two browsers ultimately depends on individual preferences and priorities.

Speed and Performance

Users can color Tabs in Brave depending on the theme color and check via the tab preview feature. However, besides that, it doesn't have any more extensive browser customization options.

It is basically for allowing the automatic filling of login forms in the future. Besides that, to ensure the security of stored passwords, Vivaldi and Brave require its users to log in with their device's password and then only allowed to access the saved passwords.

Unlike Vivaldi, Brave also offers an additional Password Management feature. It allows users to import their passwords from a CSV file and then centralize and consolidate them in one place. This feature can be useful when users have passwords stored in other applications or browsers which they want to transfer to Brave.
