Renaming in Bulk with Setapp's Renamer App

Renamer is an application that makes it possible to rename dozens of files instantly on a Mac. It is what you would term a robust application and can manage large numbers of files to cater to business and personal needs.

The app is about manipulating your designated files and folders in bulk. In other words, at the same time. It improves the organization of everything on your Mac and does this in an intelligent way convenient to its user. With all the renaming capabilities to hand, the app is necessary for businesses or individuals struggling to keep control of many files.

We all want to find out information quickly. This is only possible when we have well-arranged and easily accessible files because they are in a good and logical order that can be quickly understood. We, therefore, rely on apps such as this to do the work for us.

Other Bulk Actions Possible on a Mac

There are several other bulk actions that you can perform on your Mac. For example, you can delete multiple files or copy them to a new location. You can also merge or split multiple files into one or several new files. Additionally, you can compress or decompress multiple files at once. Finally, you can change the file extension of multiple files simultaneously.

While the app we are discussing today, Renamer is great for renaming files, and you have several other options if you want to rename in bulk on your Mac.

One such option is Finder. Finder is the default file manager on macOS and comes with some renaming capabilities built-in. To rename a batch of files using Finder, select the files you want to rename, then click on the File menu and select Rename X Items.

Another option is the Terminal app. The Terminal app is a command-line interface that allows you to execute commands to manipulate files and folders. To rename a batch of files using the Terminal, type the following command: `Rename "Old Name.ext" "New Name.ext"`.

Default, built-in, or pre-loaded Mac app file renamers tend to have limited options, so investing in a dedicated one such as Renamer is good.

The Pros of Renaming Files in Bulk

- You can save time by renaming multiple files at once when renaming files in bulk.
- It can be difficult to keep track of all the different file names you have, especially if they are spread across multiple folders. Renaming files in bulk can help organize your files and make them easier to find.
- If you have a lot of files with the same name, renaming them in bulk can help to avoid confusion.
- If you need to change the name of many files, renaming them in bulk can save you time and energy.
- Renaming files in bulk can also be helpful if you want to rename a group of files based on their attributes, such as renaming all files that end in .jpg to .png.
