AOL is one of the earliest email providers, and it still serves a large community worldwide. This free web-based email service is provided by AOL, a division of Yahoo! Inc. It isn't a fascinating email service, but it does its job while protecting user privacy and ease. AOL is free to use and available in 54 different languages.

2. CounterMail

CounterMail is a secure, user-friendly email service. It offers maximum security and privacy without involving unnecessary complexity. CounterMail uses OpenPGP, a strong encryption protocol with 4096-bit encryption keys that ensures data protection. Furthermore, it ensures utmost safety, leaving no method available for breaking OpenPGP encryption by computational or cryptographic means.

- Support Windows, MacOS X, and Linux platform
- Android phone compatibility
- Dynamic aliases

3. Gmail

Gmail is a free email service that Google has provided globally since 2004. It boasts a huge user base of 1.8 billion active users worldwide. Gmail is known for its advanced security, simplicity, and effortless integration. It has a search-oriented interface and uses Ajax.

It automatically scans emails to filter spam and malware, ensuring user security and privacy. It supports email clients via POP and IMAP protocols and provides 15 GB of free storage. Gmail is free; however, for business purposes, you need to choose one paid plan under Google Workspace. The plan starts at \$6 per user per month with 30GB of storage, which you can expand.

4. GMX (AKA Global Mail eXchange)

GMX Mail is a free email service founded (and owned) by United Internet AG in 1997. It offers webmail, POP3, and IMAP4 access. GMX is known for its extensive data allowances, including 50MB attachment limits and unlimited storage. GMX comes in two versions: Global Message eXchange for Germany only and Global Mail eXchange for international audiences.

Both versions offer high security but have slight differences. For example, the German version supports two-factor authentication, but the international version doesn't.

GMX Features

- Limitless Storage
- Every account has a Mail Collector, Address Book, Organizer, and File Storage.
- Up to 10 individual GMX email addresses per user
- Two-factor authentication (2FA)
- It supports SMTP, POP3, IMAP4, CalDAV, CardDAV, and WebDAV.

5. Hushmail

Hushmail is a web-based email service provider known for providing PGP-encrypted Email and vanity domain services. It utilizes OpenPGP standards and thus sends authenticated, encrypted messages between users with public encryption keys available.

However, messages for users without a public key are encrypted with a password. They are further stored for pickup or sent in cleartext. The iOS app was launched in 2016, offering end-to-end encryption and integration with webmail settings.

Hushmail Features

- Encrypted proprietary web-based email service
- PGP-encrypted email and vanity domain service
- Uses OpenPGP standards
- Offers cleartext and encrypted message options

6. iCloud Mail

iCloud Mail is a free webmail service provided by Apple. It allows users with an Apple ID to send, receive, and manage Emails on iCloud.com. This email service includes features like a customizable VIP list and filtering options.

It can also send large attachments of up to 5GB using iCloud Drive. It uses SSL/TLS encryption for secure communication. And for added security, iCloud Mail uses two-factor authentication. It also integrates with other Apple services, such as Contacts and Calendar.

7. Mail2World
