## What is a Single Sign-On Solution?

SSO is an authentication scheme, a way to have a user log on with a single set of login credentials on multiple software systems, apps, or websites that are related, yet independent. A good, quality solution will let a user log in once, and access the services needed without any authentication being required again.

How does it work? Well, it's actually simple. You have the software system, and the SSO provider, which has communication with tokens. When the user tries to log on, the software system sends a token with the user information to the SSO provider for verification.

If the user has logged on to a related system previously, the authentication is successful, and another token is sent back to the software system, confirming that. Then, the software system grants access to the user, and that's it - simple as that.

## Why Should You Use One?

The main argument against using a single sign-on solution is security, a.k.a. the "keys to the castle" issue, where someone gaining access to your unique credentials basically gives them access to all related services and apps. But in practice, that's actually the main benefit of a single sign-on solution.

When you need to remember (potentially) hundreds of passwords, you're dealing with password fatigue, and it's understandably hard to deal with that. This is why many users make their passwords simple and easy to remember, but they're also consequently making them easier to guess and breach, too.

If you only have a single password to remember, you'll be much more inclined to make it long, complex, and overall difficult to breach. You can mix it up with lowercase and uppercase letters, numbers, and symbols, and you won't even have to write it down because, again, it's a single password.

Then there's the fact that software adoption and integration is going to be a lot more successful. With new apps coming to market pretty much constantly, chances are that as an enterprise, you've had a situation where you wanted to use one of them to make your enterprise's business easier, but you couldn't do that because of the signup process is difficult.

Now, as an enterprise, you and your employees will deal with that. But you'll probably lose some customers that aren't exactly inclined to deal with that, and you don't want that happening.
