

# How Do I Uninstall GamePigeon from My iPhone?

GamePigeon is an iMessage app, so you can remove it either by deleting the app from your iPhone like any other app, or by deleting/disabling it from the Messages iMessage app list. Apple's current Messages settings also include a direct path for managing iMessage apps.

### Best method: delete GamePigeon from your iPhone

1. Find GamePigeon on your Home Screen or in the App Library .
2. Touch and hold the app icon.
3. Tap Remove App or Delete App .
4. Tap Delete App again to confirm.

Apple says deleting an app from the Home Screen or App Library removes it from the iPhone, and you can re-download it later from the App Store if needed.

### If GamePigeon only shows inside Messages

1. Open the Messages app.
2. Open any conversation or start a new one.
3. Tap the Add / Plus button next to the message field to open the iMessage app list.
4. Find GamePigeon in the app list.
5. Swipe left on GamePigeon and tap Delete .

Apple's Messages user guide says iMessage apps can be deleted from the Messages app by swiping left on the app and tapping Delete.

### If you only want to hide it, not uninstall it

1. Open Settings .
2. Tap Apps .
3. Tap Messages .
4. Tap iMessage Apps .
5. Turn GamePigeon off.

Apple's support article for iMessage apps says you can manage them from Settings > Apps > Messages > iMessage Apps and turn individual apps on or off.

### If GamePigeon will not delete

- Check whether Screen Time is blocking app deletion: Settings > Screen Time > Content & Privacy Restrictions > iTunes & App Store Purchases > Deleting Apps . If deleting apps is set to Don't Allow , change it first.

- If it still appears in Messages after you deleted it, restart the iPhone and check the iMessage Apps settings again. Apple's Messages settings are the official place to enable or disable remaining iMessage app entries.

### Why this happens

GamePigeon is tied to the Messages/iMessage app drawer, so some users think it is a built-in part of Messages instead of a removable app. Apple separates two actions: deleting the app from iPhone and turning the iMessage extension on or off in Messages settings. That is why GamePigeon can sometimes still appear in the Messages interface until the iMessage app list updates or is toggled off.
