

Why Does Antigravity Desktop Still Ask Me to Click "Accept" Even After Enabling "Always Process"?

Antigravity Desktop still prompts you to click "accept" even with "Always Process" (or "Always Proceed") enabled because the setting is currently broken in many recent versions and is effectively ignored for terminal-command auto-execution. This is a known bug, not a configuration mistake on your part.

Root cause

- The "Always Proceed" toggle for terminal commands exists in the UI but does not actually suppress the Run/Accept dialog in practice; the agent still halts and asks for manual approval on every command.
- User reports across multiple threads confirm that empty deny-list and a wildcard "*" allow-list, plus "Always Proceed" and "Secure Mode" turned off, still result in repeated prompts.
- Some users and developers have pointed out that this behavior stems from a missing or mis-wired effect/hook in the command-runner UI component (non-functional auto-accept logic), which is why configuration changes alone do not fix it.

Workarounds that may help

1. Reset or set environment variables (Windows Powershell example): In an elevated Powershell: `'[System.Environment]::SetEnvironmentVariable("HOME", "$env:USERPROFILE", "User")'` Restart Antigravity Desktop afterward. Some users report this stops the unnecessary prompts after the first install-day behavior.
2. Use a community patcher :A GitHub patcher exists specifically for the "Always Proceed" setting: This patch directly modifies the command-renderer logic to respect the "Always Proceed" flag.
 - Clone or download the repo: `'github.com/Kanezal/better-antigravity'` .
 - Run `'node fixes/auto-run-fix/patch.js'` inside the project, then restart Antigravity Desktop.
3. Temporarily tolerate manual approval :Given that Google's own discussion threads flag this as an open bug with no clear timeline for a fix, the only reliable "fix" for now is to either accept the prompts or live with the patcher until an official update arrives.

When to expect a proper fix

There is no publicly announced ship date for a proper fix; multiple users have asked for an ETA on the official forums, and the issue remains open as a known bug. Until Google updates the terminal-auto-execution implementation or the command-runner UI code, Antigravity Desktop will keep asking you to click "accept" even when "Always Process/Always Proceed" is enabled.
